The people were friendly, helpful, and very accommodating throughout our entire visit.

Cathy and I were invited to partake in the Inaugural Celebration of the 120<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Cavite Lodge No. 2. While this was truly an event to behold, it did occur at the sacrifice of not being able to attend the Grand Commandery Sessions as they occurred on the same day.

We left traveled across Manila Bay (which is huge) aboard the Coast Guard Ship "Boracay" to the Philippine Naval Base at Sangley Point, Cavite City. We were accompanied by WM Ian dela Cruz Encarnacion (Cavite Lodge No. 2, Magluyan Hall), WM Ericsson B. Atanacio (Manila-Mt. Lebanon Lodge No. 1) and WM Dominador R. Rosario Jr. (St. Johns-Corregidor Lodge No. 3) and their officers. There was an inspirational message from RW Raul E. Canon, Jr., Senior Grand Warden, and the guest speaker was MW Don Treng Ramas-Uypitching, Grand Master of Masons of the Grand Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons of the Philippines. We marched in a parade led by the Naval Band from the dock where we landed to the location of festivities and enjoyed a feast which featured different variations of pancit noodle dishes from different provinces. Special entertainment and musical bands performed during the day's events. Cathy enjoyed herself learning the Filipino Tinkling dance with some of the performers and singing a song with one of the Masonic First Ladies she met.

Last, but certainly not least, WM Ian dela Cruz Enarnacion arranged to take us to the old Lodge where my father was raised a Master Mason. What an incredible experience to kneel at the same altar where my father knelt for his Masonic obligation back in 1950. Personally for me, this was the highlight and most memorable point of my visit to the Philippines.
































Cavite Lodge No. 2, Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted of the Philippines is at Philippine Navy, Sangley Point, Cavite City.

#### Cavite City, Philippines

History is not always written in books and stones, but relived in the hearts and minds of men.

Cavite Lodge No. 2, F. & A.M., under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the Philippines, made history last October 21, 2023 (Saturday) when it reenacted the bay crossing of the American Masons of Manila Lodge No. 342 on board Police Boat Buckey O'Neill to constitute Cavite Lodge No. 350 in 1903.

The Manila Masons contingent was led by WM Ericsson B. Atanacio (Manila-Mt. Lebanon Lodge No. 1) and WM Dominador R. Rosario Jr. (St. Johns-Corregidor Lodge No. 3), who with their respective officers and members, boarded BRP Boracay of the Philippine Coast Guard (renamed as the Buckey O'Neill for this purpose). The contingent was then serenaded by the Philippine Navy Wind Orchestra to 12 songs from the 1900s to the present and were served with 12 different kinds of Caviteño and Filipino pancit, each song and pancit to represent a decade of Cavite Lodge No. 2's storied existence. Students from the Cavite National High School Special Program for the Arts (one of the programs being supported by the Lodge) also rendered period cultural presentations to the delight of the participants.

The 120th Charter Anniversary was likewise graced by Bro. Emmanuel F. Calairo, Chairman of the National Historical Commission of the Philippines and Member of Dasmariñas Lodge No. 346 who shared with everyone the history of the masons in Cavite and how the lodge has contributed to the building of the nation.

Members of various masonic lodges in the Philippines, the Emmanuel Baja Chapter No. 2 (Order of the DeMolay), Bethel No. 8 Cavite (Jobs Daughter International), Cavite Assembly No. 3 (International Order of the Rainbow for Girls), and other appendant bodies of the masonic family attended the occasion.

This culminating activity closes the 120th Founding and Charter Anniversary of Cavite Lodge No. 2 (2022-2023) with the theme "Isang Daang Taon ng Pusong Mason Para sa Pamilyang Mason".

#### **Paso Robles Pioneer Day 2023**

The community of Paso Robles, in northern San Luis Obispo County, has celebrated Pioneer Day every year since 1931. Organized by dedicated volunteers and funded by generous donations from individuals, businesses, churches, and service groups, this event aims to foster community bonds and honor the town's agricultural heritage. The recent celebration on October 14th featured a parade, showcasing antique tractors, horse-drawn wagons, a marching band, equestrian groups, floats, vintage cars, fire engines, historic military vehicles, and various organizations, including local Masonic lodges like Cypress Mountain Lodge No. 196 of Paso Robles.

Cypress Mountain Lodge No. 196, born from the consolidation of lodges in Cambria, Atascadero, and the original Paso Robles lodge, is one of only two lodges in District 534, along with King David's Lodge No. 209 in San Luis Obispo. I had the honor of walking with the brethren of District 534 in my Grand Captain of the Guard regalia, with thanks to Most Illustrious Grand Master Mike Sherman for granting me permission to do so. I also donned a hat which was a gift from Most Illustrious Companion Robert Morrison to his Grand Officers during his term as Grand Master in 202-2021. A float trailer towed by a truck driven by the District Inspector Worshipful Rod Smiley was also available for those who preferred not to walk.

Making the day even more special, the new DeMolay Chapter in San Luis Obispo, of which I serve as the Chapter Advisor, joined in the festivities, proudly displaying their DeMolay robes. With over 170 entries, including Shriners and other fraternal organizations, the Masons received a warm reception, and the DeMolay Chapter received very positive feedback for bringing back the sight of DeMolay robes on the streets of Paso Robles after more than 40 years.
