The food was delicious and the camaraderie was ever present. What a way to kick-off the Cryptic Year! We are now preparing to visit Omega Council on July 3rd, ride a convertible Camaro in the Newhall Independence Parade on July 4th, attend an Ice Cream Social hosted by San Luis Obispo Council on July 6th, and be guests of San Jose Council on July 14th. Our calendars are filling up Fast and Furious!

And now, a few words about business planning. During the Grand Officer's Conference this past March, your Grand Officer's approved a new and improved Illustrious Master of the Year award program. This enhancement was predicated on Grand Commandery's **Cross and Crown Award.** We had decided to adopt a similar award program, albeit with some revisions, and attach it to our **Illustrious Master of the Year Award.** This will provide the much lacking measurable metrics to the award and it will also help us determine who is most deserving. We are naming it, "**The Illustrious Master of the Year-Report Card,"** which is attached.

The intent of **The Illustrious Master of the Year-Report Card** is to encourage our Illustrious Masters to assist their respective Councils to develop certain proficiencies, and to engage in activities that will produce an enhanced membership experience, which in turn will **promote greater participation, increased membership, and reduced attrition.** As with all programs, it will need to be revisited and updated periodically based upon feedback and performance.

Please keep in mind that this incentive plan is not designed to impose any requirements upon a Constituent Council, but rather to give all Councils a set of suggested activities that will benefit the Councils. I will also consider adding some flexibility for our Department Grand Officers (DGOs), Assistant Directors of Ritual (ADRs), and our beloved Inspectors to allow points for suitable substitutions for activities not specifically indicated in the matrix.

Suggested considerations for its administration:

- The Illustrious Master of the Year-Report Card will be monitored by the DGO of each department, with input from the ADR and Inspectors.
- The selected recipient will be presented with a Certificate of Achievement, along with a \$100 gift card, which will constitute a small token of our appreciation. Both will be presented to the recipient by the DGO at Grand Sessions.
- The respective Council will also be recognized at Grand Sessions.

The Illustrious Master of the Year Award will run for the calendar year beginning January 1st. All entries must be submitted to the DGO no later than January 31st of the following year for consideration at the upcoming Grand Officers Conference. In the unlikely event of a tie, the monetary award will be shared. A minimum of 500 points required to qualify.





Officer's Biography Jonathan H. Prestage

Jonathan was born October 25, 1983, in Bakersfield, CA. He grew up in Porterville, CA, and graduated from Porterville High School. Jonathan was Initiated into Porterville's Orange Belt Lodge, No. 303, in 2003 and Passed to the degree of Fellowcraft that same year, but shipped off to Ft. Benning, Georgia for U.S. Army Basic Training and Airborne School before having been Raised as a Master Mason.

After sustaining a training injury in the Special Forces Qualification Course at Ft. Bragg, North Carolina, Jonathan received an early Honorably Discharge from the service. Once back home in California, Jonathan worked first for Target Corporation Assets Protection, and later as the Network Administrator for the Rosedale Union School District in Bakersfield, CA.

While living and working in Bakersfield, CA, Jonathan discovered the Masonic Lodge down the street from his office. In June of 2012 Jonathan became active again in Freemasonry and was Raised a Master Mason by Libertas-Security Lodge, No. 466, in Bakersfield, CA.

By October of 2012 Jonathan had moved to San Francisco, CA, and applied for Affiliation with Academia Lodge, No. 847. He served as an Officer in Academia Lodge for three years and as their Candidate's Coach for two years.

In 2013 Jonathan became a 32° Scottish Rite Mason in the Valley of Oakland, where he'd already been volunteering during the weekdays. By 2014, he had begun working part time for the Oakland Scottish Rite, a position that eventually lead to Assistant Rental Manager, Assistant Secretary, and finally General Secretary of the Scottish Rite Valley, where he's currently employed and retains a Life Membership. He's also a member of the Guthrie Scottish Rite Valley in Guthrie, OK, and the Guthrie Academy of Reflection. On September 16, 2017 Jonathan was Invested a Knight Commander of the Court of Honour by the Scottish Rite Valley of Oakland.

Jonathan is an Honorary DeMolay, Order of DeMolay International, having received the degrees in San Francisco, CA. In the Oakland High Twelve Club, No. 2, Jonathan is a Past as well as the current President.

In 2016, Jonathan was appointed to the Grand Lodge Annual Communications Activities Committee, which he still serves today, and is in the Grand Master's Circle of Donors contributing to the California Masonic Foundation and the Masonic Home in Union City, CA.

In November of 2016 Jonathan was installed the founding Senior Warden of Templum Rosae Lodge, No. 863, Free and Accepted Masons of California, which meets at the Oakland Scottish Rite Center in Oakland, CA, and was installed as Worshipful Master on January 13, 2019. On February 9, 2019 he was installed as Marshal of the Masters' and Past Masters' Association of Alameda and Contra Costa Counties.

Jonathan is a Past High Priest of Siminoff-Daylight Chapter, No. 163, of Royal Arch Masons, and the current Excellent High Priest of the California Golden State Research Chapter of Royal Arch Masons.
